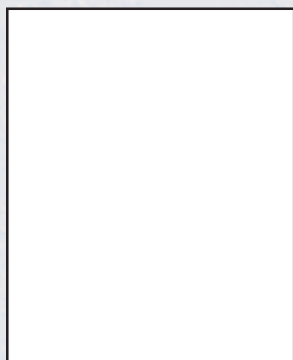

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Lt. Amit Singh Foundation (ASM Foundation) was established in the year 2001 as a registered charitable trust in recognition to the supreme sacrifice of Lt. Amit Singh. Before being a Martyr, Lt. Amit Singh fought fearlessly with valour to safeguard his motherland against hardcore militants in adverse circumstances in the Kupwara district of Jammu & Kashmir in 2000. In his remembrance, the ASM Foundation has been meticulously carrying out various activities in the sphere of education, economic upliftment, health and social values for the betterment of the people of the countryside for transforming India into a developed nation. The Foundation has done for the economic prosperity of the society, rural employment, preservation of environment and biodiversity in its agenda.

Quite alike previous years, the year 2010 was also an eventful year for the Foundation. It organized a four-day “Swadesh Prem Jagriti Sangosthi” (2nd in the series) in collaboration with University of Horticultural Sciences, Bagalkot at Bangalore from 28 to 31 May, 2010. A number of distinguished dignitaries attended the various functions of the Sangosthi which encouraged the moral of the students, farmers, scientists, youth and underprivileged immensely.

The activities of the Sangosthi act as an impetus for the students, farmers and rural youth in achieving their goals. The Sangosthi and the Health Camp were inaugurated by His Holiness Sri Sri Ravishankar Guru Ji, Founder of Art of Living. The prize distribution of the National Debate and Essay Competition for the school and college students and National Exhibition on Horticulture and allied Fields were done by Dr. B.S.Yediyurappa, Hon’ble Chief Minister, Govt. of Karnataka. The National Conference on “Horticultural Biodiversity for Livelihood, Economic Development and Health Care” and Mango Diversity Show were inaugurated by His Excellency Governor of Karnataka, Shri Hans Raj Bhardwaj. Besides, there were activities like release of souvenir and books, distribution of quality seeds, farmers’ quiz, mango eating competition, distribution of awards, plaque of honour and certificates followed by cultural programmes during the Sangosthi 2010.

In the year 2010, Sahid Diwas was observed on 3rd September under the Chairmanship of Dr. Gopal Ji Trivedi, former Vice-chancellor, RAU, Pusa. The Branch Office of the Foundation of Mahamada also executed several activities for the benefit of children by providing them educational and vocational support.

For the economic upliftment of rural people in Bihar and Karnataka, the Foundation has undertaken several activities for the farming community to augment productivity of crops, improve their livelihood and socio-economic condition. The Mahamada Branch also made an excellent effort to disseminate the improved vegetable seeds (cauliflower and cabbage) and technologies with the help of Advanta Seeds Pvt Ltd at Mahamada and Mutlumpur villages in Bihar during the year 2010. The scientific training and improved production technology demonstration to farmers have become very popular on account of the active involvement of the Foundation. These activities including demonstrations and trainings will continue to be the significant feature of the Foundation in the years to come benefitting rural youth and farming community of the country.

The ASM Foundation has instituted two prestigious additional awards in year 2010 named Amit Krishi Rishi and Amit Padma Jagriti for those who have made outstanding contributions in Indian Agriculture and dedicated their service to the Nation. The Foundation is extremely thankful to all who provided guidance and support and thank all its staff members, volunteers, supporters, donors and others who have directly and indirectly supported the activities of the ASM Foundation.

INTRODUCTION

Gallantry Lt. Amit Singh was born at village Mahamada, District Samastipur, Bihar on June 28, 1979. Since his childhood, he displayed a unique nationalistic fervour and invariably talked of serving the Nation. As time went by, he grew up and joined the National Defence Academy in the year 1996. After being Commissioned as Lieutenant, he joined 1/9 Gorkha Rifles on 3rd June 2000. Lt Amit Singh, loved by one and all, sacrificed his life for the motherland on 3rd September 2000 in Kupwara district of Jammu & Kashmir fighting against hardcore terrorists. His fight was so vehement that he continued his resistance against the anti-nationals even after being shot several bullets in his body. Lt. Amit Singh, who always valued his commitment to the nation and the society, is inspiration for up to 100 million people. His sacrifice reminds us to tell- *“when you go home, tell them of us and say for your tomorrow, we gave our today”*. Recognizing the supreme sacrifice of the Lt. Amit Singh, a Foundation in his name was set up in 2001 as Lt. Amit Singh Memorial Foundation, and is headed by Mrs. Bimala Singh, his mother. The Foundation is not only devoted to the nation but is also committed to inculcate patriotism through education, economic upliftment, health and social values amongst the youth in particular and mass in general.

The four pronged objectives of the ASM Foundation are education, economic upliftment of the people, securing the health and inculcating the social values among the people. The ASM Foundation made concerted efforts in fulfilling the objectives of the foundation and made remarkable achievements in the year 2010.

A. EDUCATION

i. National Elocution / Essay Competition

The ASM Foundation sincerely believes in educating and nurturing young talents who are virtually treasures for the nation's future. Inculcating patriotism among the schoolchildren through essay/debate competition to strengthen national security has been the motto of the Foundation. In this regard, an inspirational essay competition on the topic “Duties of Indian Citizen in National Security” was organized for the students (8th – 12th Std) at school, district, state and ultimately at national level. The first three successful candidates were given cash prizes (Rs 10,000, Rs 7,500 and Rs 5,000, respectively), citations, plaques of honour and certificates.

ii. National Horticulture Talent Search

As horticulture is emerging as one of the best options for addressing the concern of food, nutrition and health care, it is pertinent to search talent in this field. Accordingly, the Foundation has instituted an award for students having best skill in Horticulture. Search was made at national level among the students graduating in Agriculture/Horticulture. Essay



competition on topic “Horticulture as means of Livelihood, Economic Development and Health Care” was organized. Students came out with the storming ideas on this topic. The winners of the competition were awarded cash prizes (₹ 25000, ₹ 15000 and ₹ 10000 for first, second and third prize, respectively), citations, plaques of honour and certificates.

iii. Educational And Vocational Development

Children's Education: The branch office of ASM Foundation carried out various educational and vocational development activities for the benefit of rural children during 2010. Felicitating education to the underprivileged section of the society, has been one of the primary objectives of the ASM Foundation. Educational kits (books and magazines, pens and pencils, school bags etc.) were distributed to the children to make them excel in their educational field through better academic attainments. In addition, the ASM Foundation also provided assistance to the needy children of different villages in Pusa in order to sustain their educational attainments for development.



iv. Publications Of Books And Report

Educationists and scientists connected with the ASM Foundation brought about several books and report. The Annual Report of the ASM Foundation, Souvenir titled “Sodh Chintan” covering various technologies, special issue of “Indian Horticulture - Organic Horticulture” written by Dr. H.P. Singh and Dr. G.V. Thomas, “Horticulture in Different Agro Climatic Condition” written by Dr H.P. Singh and Dr. M.S Palaniswami, “A to Z Horticulture - Fruits & Plantation Crops” and A to Z Horticulture - Floriculture, Landscaping & Medicinal & Aromatic Plants” written by Dr. Babita Singh and Dr. Ajeet Singh “Endangered Medicinal Plants”, and “Eye Care for children” were released by the dignitaries during the Sangosthi 2010.



v. Farmers Quiz

As an educational quiz covering the recent technologies creates awareness and help in the dissemination of farm technologies to the farmers. In this regard, a quiz programme for the farmers was organized to update them on the technological front. The quiz programme created tremendous interest amongst the farmers while updating them on the recent technologies for enhancing productivity and profitability. At the end of the quiz programme, winners were awarded cash prizes and certificates.



B. ECONOMIC UPLIFTMENT

One of the predominant objectives of the ASM is to work for the economic upliftment of the farming community through distribution of quality seeds and seedlings, educating the farmers through awareness programs, farm technologies and products exhibitions and scientists' visit programmes.

i. Distribution Of Quality Seeds

In course of fulfilling the objectives of the economic upliftment through technology dissemination, seeds of vegetable crops were distributed to the poor farmers. Hybrid maize seeds donated by Dr. Raj Gupta was distributed to the farmers during



the Sangosthi 2010. The ASM Foundation, Mahamada Branch had also made an excellent effort to disseminate the improved vegetable production technologies (cauliflower and cabbage) with the help of Advanta Seed Pvt. Ltd. at Mahamada and Mutlumpur villages in Bihar in the year 2010. During the Sahid Diwas celebration, Managing Trustee of Lt. Amit Singh Foundation distributed vegetable seeds to the poor farmers and more than 55 farmers were benefited free supply of with quality seeds of cauliflower and cabbage.



ii. National Conference on Horticultural Biodiversity

The National Conference on Horticultural Biodiversity for Livelihood, Economic Development and Health Care was held at Bangalore from 29-30 May, 2010. The Conference was one of the major activities of Swadesh Prem Jagriti Sangosthi – 2010 held at campus of University of Horticultural Sciences, Bagalkot. The Conference was organized by the ASM Foundation with the support of Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) along with International, National and State organizations, which was attended, by experts and farmers across the country. The deliberations and recommendation of the conference would help in enhancing the knowledge on biodiversity and farmers rights.

iii. National Exhibition On Horticulture and Allied Sector

The strength in horticultural technology and inputs were exhibited during the Sangosthi 2010 in HORTI EXPO. The exhibition provided an excellent platform for exhibiting the technologies and value-added products for budding entrepreneurs in the field of Agriculture/Horticulture, different institutes, industries, corporate sectors and farmers. Dignitaries and participants of the exhibition showed keen interest in the expo there were a total 120 stalls from ICAR Institutes, Agricultural Universities, State Governments, private companies, co-operative societies, various other professional societies and also farmers. The exhibitions were mostly related to new varieties, planting material, plant health management, health care, organic cultivation, efficient irrigation systems, production systems of fruits, vegetables, flowers, plantation crops, medicinal and aromatic plants, spices, tuber crops, potato etc.. The exhibition provided the knowledge for increasing the productivity and income of the farmers.

iv. Visit of Agriculture Scientists

The ASM Foundation, Mahamada branch, has made an excellent effort in dissemination of improved technologies in mango and citrus production with the help of Biodiversity International. In



the process awareness programmes were organised to disseminate knowledge about biodiversity and related fruit plant practices by the group of expert scientists involved in Biodiversity. 250 progressive farmers of Mahamada, Jagdishpur, Dhowgama, Murliyachek, Bhuskol and Harpur villages in Samastipur and Muzaffarpur districts were selected. In order to monitor the status of mango and citrus plant and farmers' feedback, Dr Bhuwon Sthapit RPC, Biodiversity International with his team had visited these villages along with representatives of ASM Foundation. The team was fully satisfied with the mango and citrus fruits plants establishment and received over whelming response from the farmers. The ASM Foundation aims to expedite this attempt further with the help from such Institutions.

v. Mango Diversity Show

The commemoration of 'International Biodiversity Year' and to create awareness about the varietal wealth and its importance in conservation, 'Mango Biodiversity Exhibition' was organized during Sangosthi 2010. Mango varieties from the Peninsular region of India were displayed by the Indian Institute of Horticultural Research, Hassaraghatta, 'Fruit Research Station', Sangareddy, University of Agricultural Sciences, Dharwad and Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Periyakulam. More than hundred varieties of mango were displayed. The North Indian varieties were displayed by Central Institute of Subtropical Horticulture, Lucknow, and National Research Centre for Litchi, Muzaffarpur and GBPUAT, Pantnagar. The local collections from Andaman Islands were also displayed during the exhibition. The exhibits of different categories viz., fresh fruits, homemade products, grafted sapling etc were arranged. The mango diversity show encouraged the farmers and nurserymen for producing quality planting materials and cultivation of improved varieties for higher income and profitability.

To encourage the participation from the farmers and research institutes, best exhibits were awarded with prizes. One of the farmers, Mr. Ghani Khan, who has conserved unique types of mango dating back to Tippu Sultan's period from Mandya displayed about 120 unique indigenous types, which has various skin colour, aroma and shape. He also maintains unique indigenous germplasm collection of other crop species and distributes them to other farmers. He bagged the first prize for indigenous collections of unique varieties.

C. SECURING HEALTH

i. Care For Secured Health

ASM Foundation's vision is to serve the people for secured health. Efforts are being directed towards providing better health to the needy people. The Foundation organized health camps comprising of eye camp, naturopathy, acupuncture and wellness camp during Swadesh Prem Jagriti Sangosthi. The



health camp was conducted by General Physician, Dr. Jayaprakash Alva, Pediatrician Dr. Ramapriya, eye surgeon Dr. Venkata Subramaniam, Dental Surgeon Dr. N. Mahesh and Shri Navinchandra Dr. Shah who is a self-motivated Naturopath of repute. During the camp, medicines and spectacles were distributed free of cost to needy patients.

ii. Special Talk On The Wellness

Dr P. I. Peter, Chairman, Noni Biotech India, Chennai delivered a talk on wellness of people and explained elaborately the social, educational and health aspects. He wished for wellness awareness of 100 crores Indian population and wished to create a world of wellness and healthy society where everybody is happy and healthy. He suggested ten points for healthy life. The talk created an awareness on wellness among the people.

D. SOCIAL VALUES

i. Adhyamic Gosthi

ASM Foundation is working fearlessly for the development of society having social values and commitment for the preservation of Indian values. Towards this, the Foundation organized Adhyatmic gosthi to spread the spirituality and harmony among the people. Adhyatmic gosthi was presented by the disciples of His Holiness Sri Sri Ravi Shankar Guruji. Spiritual and communal songs highlighted the event, which brought a sense of unity among different people to work towards fulfilling the duty of the present birth.

ii. Message For National Integration Through Cultural Program

A message reflecting the national integration and sense of humanity can be better conveyed by the way of songs and dance. ASM Foundation organized cultural event during the Sangosthi 2010. Unity among the diverse Indian states was exhibited in the form of Indian folk by the professional dancers.

i. Mango eating competition

A mango eating competition was organized during the Sangosthi 2010 which showed a formidable response, a large group of people irrespective of age and gender participated in the competition.

ii. Visit of dignitaries

Several dignitaries Sh. Narendra Singh, Agriculture Minister, Govt of Bihar and other guests visited the ASM Foundation and paid their rich tribute to the great soul Lt. Amit Singh at Mahamada village, Samastipur, Bihar.
